> Collections

The Library holds a range of unique collections including the Grainger Museum, Rare Books, Rare Music, the Print Collection and the University of Melbourne Archives. These collections can be accessed in the Reading Room (Baillieu Library, Level 3).

The University of Melbourne has 11 libraries across 6 campuses – Parkville, Southbank, Dookie, Creswick, Burnley and Werribee. We provide access to more than 3.6 million items including books, ebooks, maps, journals, videos, DVDs, music, archives and much more.

> Opening hours

Opening hours vary between libraries and change at different times of the year. Check the Library website for current hours. If you are a University of Melbourne student, you can also access study spaces and computers in select branches outside library opening hours by using your student card to swipe in. > Searching the Library

Use the Library catalogue to find books, ebooks, journal titles, audio visual and media resources and more.

University of Melbourne students and staff can use Discovery to search simultaneously across multiple databases including the Library catalogue, digital repository, ebook collections and journal databases.

> Borrowing, renewing, and returning

You can borrow up to 100 items (with a few exceptions) by using your student or staff card. See the Library website for details.

Loan periods vary from 2 hours to 90 days. Most items can be renewed up to 10 times. Hourly and overnight loans cannot be renewed. Items requested via BONUS+ can only be renewed once.

If an item you need is on loan or not held in the Library, there are options available to borrow from a non-University of Melbourne library via, BONUS+, an inter-library loan or CAVAL card.

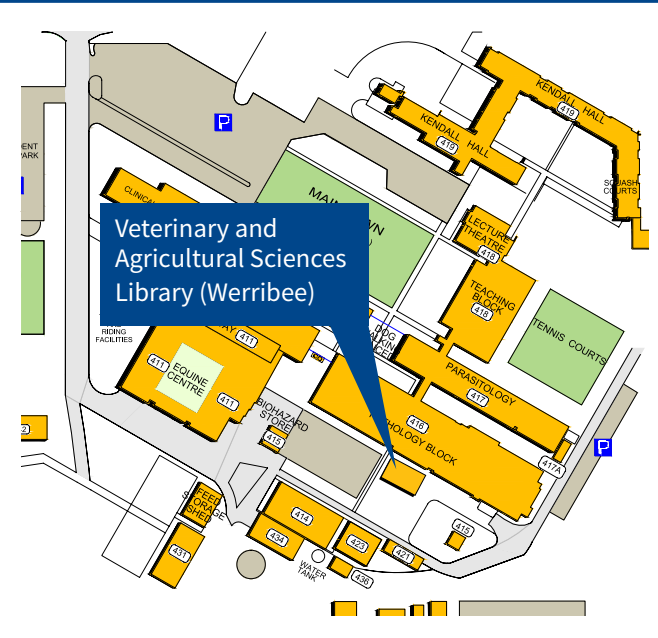

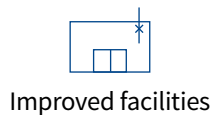

Southbank campus redevelopment

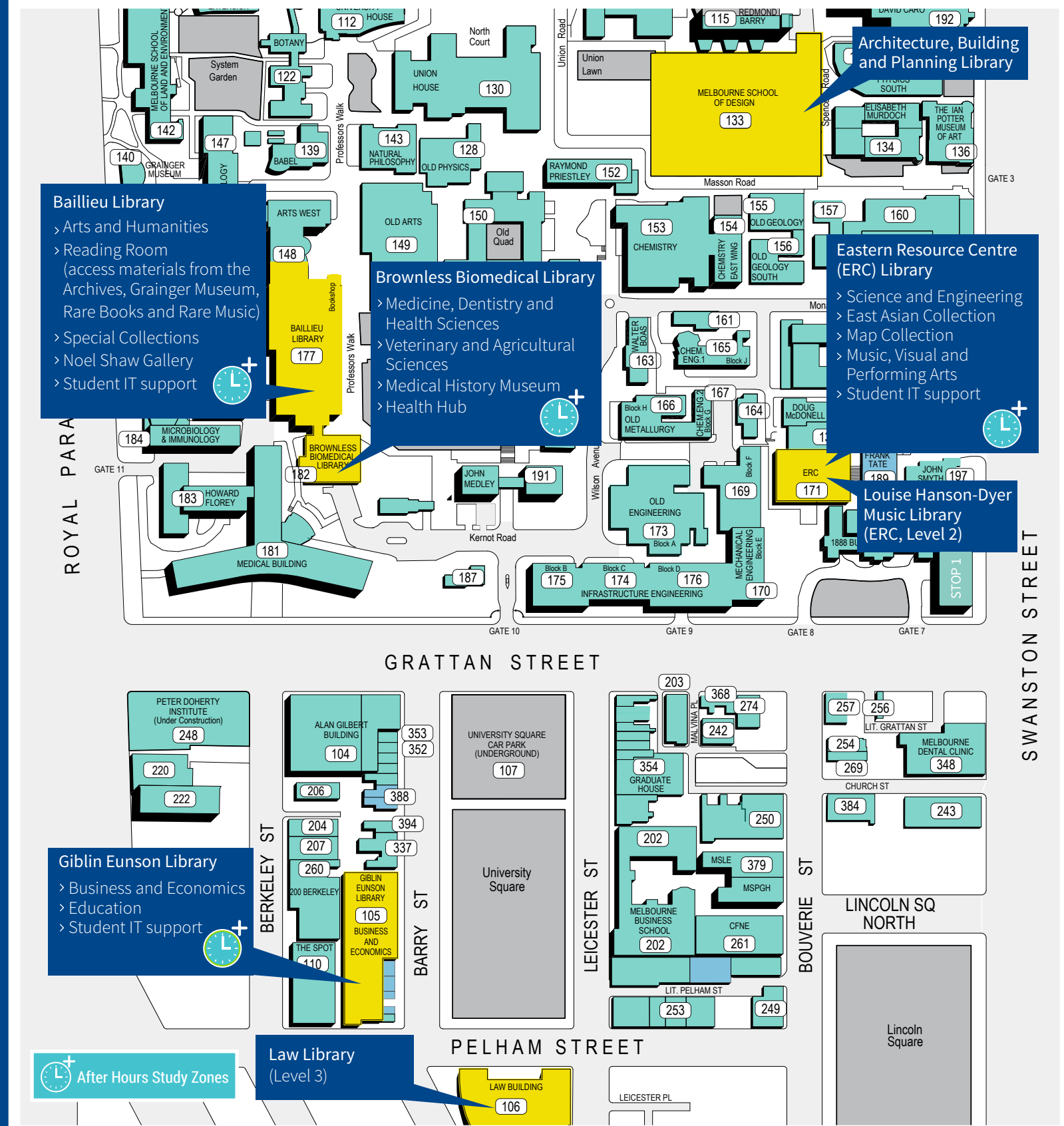
